A true grass roots effort

A vision of Sandra Roback and Ken Miller, Green Power Garden is continually made possible through the donations and



efforts of many people in the community. With the help of Ken and Bobby Miller who donated the use of their land, their tools, timber, and water and with guidance of Master Gardener Volunteers Janet Manke-Fischer and Barb Havas, Green Power Garden was started on the outskirts of Waukesha, only a few miles from the Hope Center.

The Hope Center distributes fresh produce and uses the produce to make healthy meals for the homeless and others who are impoverished. In 2012 the gardens were combined into one large area donated, mowed and tilled by Larry Spleas. Through the years we borrowed a sheds, water storage tanks, and received donations of many plants, seeds, tomato stakes, wagons and hand tools. To date we have harvested 25,,000 pounds of food. In 2016, there were many changes at the garden property. We received a new shed from the Hope Center (they came out to assemble it too) Ken Miller excavated the spot and Payne and Dolan donated the rock to level it off. Larry also emptied and razed the Lawnsdale School building. We received recycled pool covers to use as weed block in some of our plots. We were blessed with rain almost every week of the season and thus were blessed with healthy plants (and plenty of weeds too). The cooler weather and weeds did not bode well for the tomato harvest or the sweet potatoes, and most of the corn was eaten by animals right after planting. But, we still harvested over 3500 pounds for the season and the beans produced from spring through fall!
